- 6mm toughened safety glass with a black ceramic border.
- → 16mm Argon cavity with black super spacer.
- 6mm toughened low e-soft coat inner.

## **Triple Glazed** U-value of 0.7 W/m<sup>2</sup>K


The Skyseal® Frameless Triple-Glazed unit has a 50mm profile constructed from:

- 6mm toughened safety glass with a black ceramic border.
- 16mm Argon cavity with Black super spacer.
- 6mm toughened low e-soft coat inner pane.
- 16mm Argon cavity with Black super spacer.
- 6mm toughened low e-soft coat inner.



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## Delivery and Installation

#### **UK Delivery**

All deliveries can be made direct to site, anywhere in the UK. Using our own fleet vans, our team of experienced drivers will call you within 24 hours of placing the order and the driver will call the customer on the day of delivery when they are an hour away from site before they arrive.

#### **Fast Installation**

In addition to your new Skyseal® Frameless rooflight you will need:

- Silicone Adhesive: Dowsil® 791
- Mastic Gun applicator.
- Glass Suction lifting handles for larger units.
- Materials and tools to construct and prepare a timber kerb.

Please take precautions when moving and lifting heavy objects and working at height. Make sure to use the correct equipment and ensure sufficient people are available to lift the roof light onto the roof and into position on the timber kerb.

## Flat Roof Installation Guide

#### **Building Regulations**

All building materials used and construction work carried out should be completed in accordance with Building Regulations Part L.

Part L is a set of regulations that deals with the conservation of fuel and power in buildings.
Part L sets out the thermal efficiency requirements for new and existing buildings.

If in any doubt, please consult your local build control for advice before starting any work.


## **Step 1 – Constructing the Timber Kerb**

An upstand built on site should have a maximum U-value of  $0.35W/(m^2K)$ . The lower the U-value the better the thermal performance is.

Construct an 85mm (max) wide timber kerb for your roof light. This should be a minimum of 150mm in height at the lowest point from the finished roof level.


The internal dimensions of the structural opening should match the size of the specified Skyseal® Frameless roof light. E.g. a 600mm x 600mm roof light will require a structural internal opening of 600mm x 600mm.


Your roof light needs to be a minimum of 5 degrees to allow water run-off. If your roof does not have this pitch, build the angle into your timber kerb. We recommend that you run the fall across the width or 'shorter side' of the roof light when building an angled kerb, as the fall will be less noticeable, which will improve the internal and external aesthetics.




Example of a 5-degree minimum pitch: This equates to a grade of 1:11.5. E.g. a roof light with 1000mm width will require a fall of 87mm.


**Step 1** | Construct your insulated timber upstand as described in the previous section.


Step 2 | Install your chosen waterproof covering making sure you waterproof both the vertical upstand and horizontal areas, across the top surface of the upstand as per the manufacturer's guidelines.

**Step 3** Install a timber batten (minimum 25mm wide) to support the roof light on the inside of the upstand kerb. The timber batten should be installed the correct height from the top of the waterproof layer on top of the upstand. (28mm for double glazed and 44mm for triple glazed).

**Step 4** | Apply a bead of **DOWSIL® 791** to:

- 1) The bottom inner pane support batten.
- Directly to the waterproof membrane on the top of the upstand (area marked in green).

**Step 5** | Carefully lift the Skyseal® frameless roof light into position. Ensure that the roof light beds equally onto the DOWSIL® 791 waterproof sealant.

Apply a bead of DOWSIL® 791 silicone to the underside of the rooflight where it meets the waterproof upstand as a secondary protection against water penetration.
